


HISTORIC SITE LICENCE FOR SHIDAS LANE LAGOON OLDBURY

Condition 1 defined types of waste to be deposited.

i.e a mixture of extremely hazardous strong acids. See below.

A virtual rewrite of the site licence within just a few months of issue.

Condition 1 withdrawn and replaced with new condition 1 to read

On Page 3, Condition 1 shall be withdrawn and replaced by:

The licence holder shall operate the facility in accordance with the conditions specified and shall notify the Waste Disposal Authority of any proposed change in the conduct of operations, as altered by any previously notified changes, at least one month before the proposed change is implemented. The types and quantities of wastes discharged to the facility shall not exceed the following:

Surface Water		
Inorganic acid wastes	5	tonnes/day
Acid and alkali swill waters	872	tonnes/day
Regeneration Wastes, derust, alkaline cleaners and bonderite	4	tonnes/day
Soaps	2	tonnes/week

These wastes shall arise only from TI Accles and Pollock Limited's own operations at Paddock Works and from Broadwell Works in the case of an emergency.

N.B the wastes were even less specific here than before.

Condition 2 withdrawn and replaced

Condition 2 shall be withdrawn and replaced by:

Records shall be kept of the types and quantities of wastes deposited at and removed from the facility. In the case of wastes being removed from the site the record shall also show the destination of the wastes being removed. These records shall be open to inspection at any reasonable time and copies, in a form approved by the Waste Disposal Authority, shall be sent to the Waste Disposal Authority every month or at any other period as may be required.

Condition 3 withdrawn and replaced

Condition 3 shall be withdrawn and replaced by:

Within six months of the date of issue of this amendment a programme of works shall have been commenced to neutralize the lagoon such that within a period of 18 months from the date of issue of this amendment the pH of the lagoon shall be in the range 7-10.

Condition 4 withdrawn and replaced

Condition 4 shall be withdrawn and replaced by:

Adequate measures shall be taken, to the satisfaction of the Waste Disposal Authority, to ensure that overtopping of the lagoon into watercourse, sewer or surrounding land does not occur.

Condition 5 (site security) retained

Condition 6 withdrawn and replaced

Condition 6 shall be withdrawn and replaced by:

If the use of the facility is required after three years from the date of issue of this amendment and the measured inflow significantly exceeds the outflow, further discharges to the facility will be subject to a satisfactory hydrogeological survey being carried out. This survey will be regarded as satisfactory if it demonstrates that the discharge of the proposed types and quantities of wastes into the marl-hole will not be environmentally detrimental when the total liquid in the marl-hole is kept within the pH range 7-10.

Condition 7 withdrawn and replaced

Condition 7 shall be withdrawn and replaced by:

Should discharges to the facility be terminated at any time, the lagoon shall be left such that the pH is in the range 7 to 10.

Condition 8 withdrawn and replaced

Condition 8 shall be withdrawn and replaced by:

Should any infilling or alternative uses be proposed for the lagoon, these will be subject to the separate agreement of the Waste Disposal Authority.

CONDITIONS 9-13 ADDED REGARDS TREATMENT OF LAGOON

| Condition 9 | Sufficient instrumentation shall be provided and utilised to assure that a satisfactory standard of treatment is maintained at the facility and to warn of any malfunction. This instrumentation to be regularly checked and maintained and malfunctions rectified without delay. |
| Condition 10 | The facility and its immediate environs shall be kept clean and tidy at all times so that both it and its operations are aesthetically compatible with the surrounding area. |
| Condition 11 | Operational instructions shall be kept available and displayed at the facility. |
| Condition 12 | Tanks used for storage and treatment of liquids shall be bunded to the satisfaction of the Waste Disposal Authority. They shall be of a type and construction suitable for the liquids they contain and shall be labelled to show their contents. |
| Condition 13 | Adequate management and technical supervision shall be provided throughout operating hours and during any maintenance operations. |

OTHER CONDITIONS 14-18 ADDED

Other Conditions

- Condition 14 The terms and conditions of the licence shall be made known to any person who is given responsibility for the management or control of the facility, and a copy of these conditions shall be displayed at an appropriate point.
- Condition 15 A copy of any notice or instruction received in respect of the facility from any Authority other than the Waste Disposal Authority which in any way relates to the use of the parts of the site licenced under this legislation, shall be given to the Waste Disposal Authority within three days of receipt of the said notice or instruction.
- Condition 16 Any cessation of operations which require the transfer or diversion of wastes normally disposed of at the site to facilities elsewhere shall be notified to the Waste Disposal Authority.
- Condition 17 Any temporary cessation of operations for a period in excess of three months shall be notified to the Waste Disposal Authority.
- Condition 18 Discussions concerning the conditions of this licence may take place at any time at the instigation of the Company or the Waste Disposal Authority.

MODIFICATION 2 WMCC 22/12/1982

Condition 1 deleted and replaced with added condition 19

Delete Condition 1, and add the following Condition.

- Condition 19. The licence holder shall operate the facility in accordance with the conditions specified and shall notify the Waste Disposal Authority of any proposed change in the conduct of operations, as altered by any previously notified changes, at least one month before the proposed change is implemented. The types and quantities of wastes discharged to the facility shall not exceed the following:-

Surface water	
Inorganic acid wastes	5 tonnes/day
Acid and alkali still waters	872 tonnes/day
Regeneration wastes; derust, alkaline cleaners and bonderite	4 tonnes/day
Soaps	2 tonnes/day

These wastes shall arise only from TI Accles and Pollock Limited's own operations at Paddock Works and Broadwell Works.

Such modifications shall take effect on 23rd December, 1982 at 9 a.m.

MODIFICATION 3 SMBC 17/2/1987

Licence modified to delete condition 19 and replace with condition 20

Condition 20

The licence holder shall operate the facility in accordance with the conditions specified and shall notify the Waste Disposal Authority of any proposed change in the conduct of operations, as altered by any previously notified changes, at least one month before the proposed change is implemented. The types and quantities of wastes discharged to the facility shall not exceed the following:-

Surface water

Acid and alkali swill waters	872 tonnes/day
Regeneration wastes; derust, alkaline cleaners and bonderite	4 tonnes/day

21. Any change to the details of the technically competent management in control of the facility, previously notified to the WRA, shall be notified to the WRA immediately and confirmed in writing within 14 working days.
22. In the event of the licence holder and/or any relevant person being convicted of any relevant offence (as defined in Regulation 3 of The Waste Management Licensing Regulations 1994 or any amendment to the aforementioned Regulation) then full details shall be provided to the WRA within 14 days of conviction. Such details shall include, in respect of each relevant person, the nature of the offence, the place where the conviction was heard and any sentence, fine or other penalty imposed.

NOTICE OF SUSPENSION OF AUTHORISATION TO CARRY ON ACTIVITIES

WHEREAS on the 16th March 1978 the West Midlands County Council granted you a disposal licence (now to be treated as a waste management licence) relating to land at Paddock Works, Oldbury, Warley, West Midlands

AND WHEREAS on 16th January 1979, 22nd December 1982, 17th February 1987 and 5th February 1996 the said licence was modified

AND WHEREAS it appears to the Environment Agency (the powers and duties of all the waste regulation authorities in England and Wales being transferred to the Environment Agency on 1st April 1996 by virtue of Section 2 of the Environment Act 1995) that you have not paid the subsistence charge(s) due under Section 41 of the Environment Act 1995 and Waste Management Licensing (Charges) Schemes 1999 – 2000 and 2000 – 2001.

AND WHEREAS the outstanding subsistence charge(s) payable to the Environment Agency remain at the sum of £33,525

NOW the Environment Agency **HEREBY SUSPENDS** with effect from 12.00 hours on 18th February 2002 the licence insofar as it permits the carrying on of the activities specified in Schedule I.

This suspension is to cease when the subsistence charge(s) in the sum of £33,525 (and any other subsistence charge notified by the Agency as due between the date of this notice and the cessation of the suspension) has been paid in full.

FURTHER note that you still remain bound by the requirements of the licence that are listed in Schedule II
